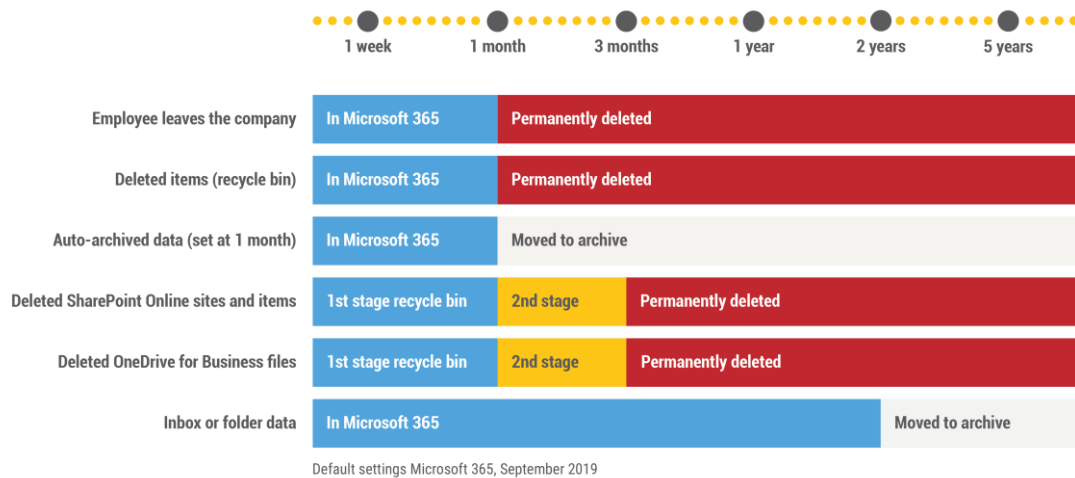




Why do you have to back up Microsoft 365 data?

Isn't Microsoft responsible for data backup?

No. Microsoft makes sure the Microsoft 365 platform is available through geo-redundancy. Microsoft only offers (short-term) data availability.



Expanding availability

Microsoft 365 does not have a comprehensive backup solution. Once the retention period expires, data will be deleted and cannot be recovered.

Protecting yourself against ransomware attacks

Microsoft expressly states that recovery of Exchange data at a certain point in time is not possible. Keeping a separate copy of the data makes it possible to recover quickly from an attack.

Planning an exit scenario

Planning exit scenarios from the beginning should be the part of every business decision, especially when it comes to your own data.



Avoid dependencies & blackmail

Compliance
